




Mma Sophie, mosadi wa sebete

"Thušang! Khosi o a nwelela!" Nozipho a goeletša.




Ka ponyo ya leihlo, Mma Sophie a a fofela ka

lebogiša ka bonatla le bogale bja gagwe.


“Ke a leboga gore ke kgonne go phološa bophelo bja
