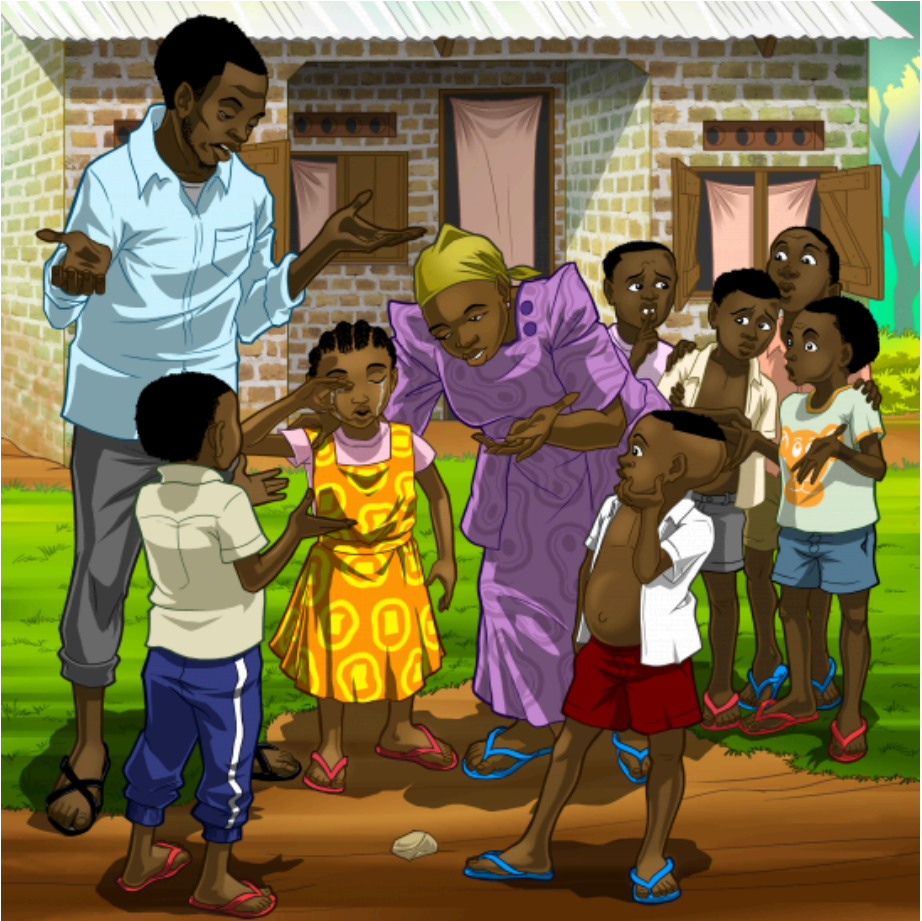




UKhathaza wabe athandwa aligugu. Wabe athola koke akufunako kubabelethi bakhe.

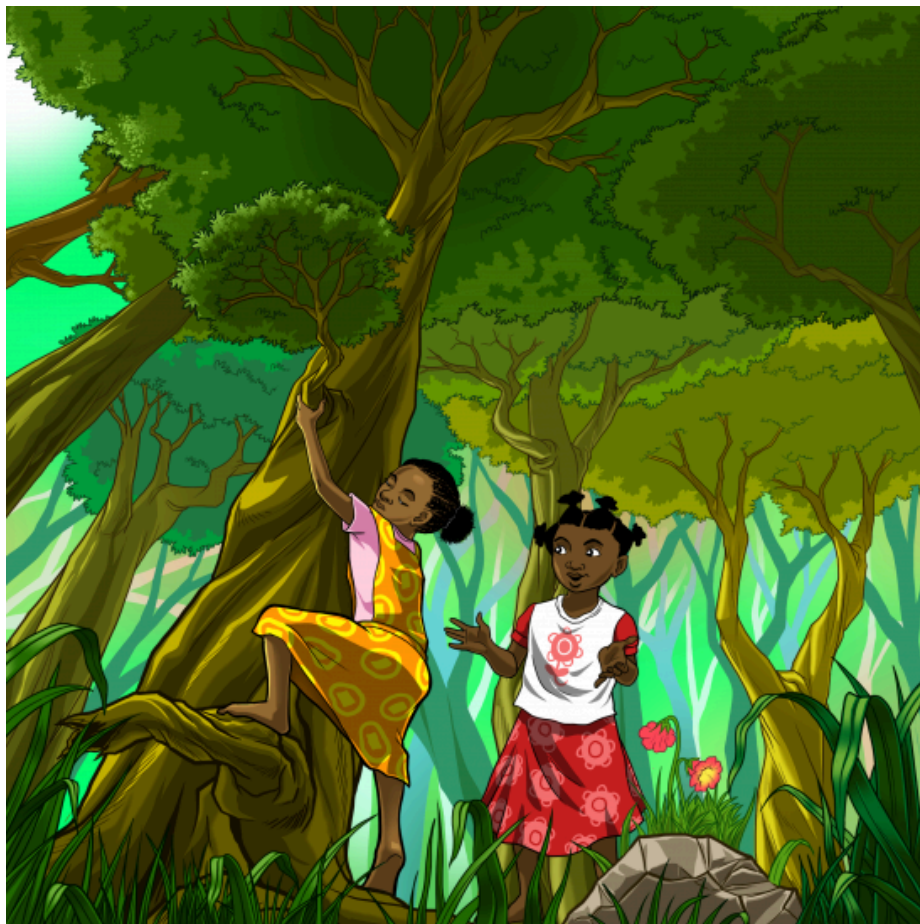
